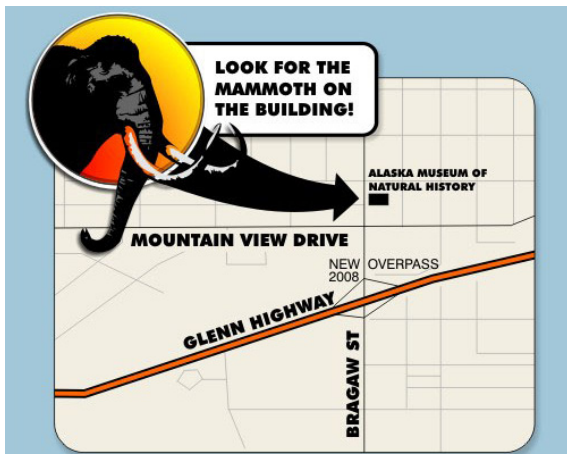

# Workshops

**GEOLOGY ROCKS:** Explore in detail the formation of the Earth and how this relates to the rock cycle using our touchable stream table, land forms and Alaska's largest rock and mineral collection. (Grades 3-5)

**POLAR DINOSAURS:** Compare and contrast the characteristics of polar dinosaurs and dinosaurs from other parts of the world. Learn which dinos lived in Alaska millions of years ago. (Pre-k, All grades)

**BONES:** Discover and touch many different types of bone, learn interesting facts, examine X-rays, cross section models, and play "CSI" with a real skeleton. (Grades 3-5, 6-8)

**LIVING IN THE ICE AGE:** Examine and learn about ancient Alaskan's ice age tools. Try mammoth hunting, mitten sowing, and tour the predators and prey that make up the ice age ecosystem and food chain. (Pre-k, All grades)

**ROCKS & FOSSILS:** This workshop offers a more generalized view of rock types and focuses on the formation of fossils. Compare, contrast, and touch fossils through time and discover living fossils. (Grades 3-6)

**ALASKAN ANIMALS:** Explore Alaska's animals (air, land and sea) and discover what can be learned from their poo, peepers and paws. Create Alaskan food chains. (Pre-k, k-2)

## **NEW!:**

**PALEO PLANTS:** Dig in to how plants have changed their structure through time, their impact on the Earth and why invasive plants are harmful. Examine and touch Alaskan plant fossils and teeth from ancient herbivores. (Grades 1-3)

**WATER, WATER EVERYWHERE:** Explore the water cycle and how it has changed Alaska's landscape through time, from glaciers and rivers to the ocean. (Grades 1-3)
